# KEYNOTE SPEAKER: ANDREW DEFRANZA



Andrew DeFranza has served as the Executive Director of Harborlight Homes since 2007. Harborlight develops, manages, and advocates for high quality, service-enriched affordable homes for essential workers, fixed-income elderly, disabled individuals, and those who struggle with homelessness. Under DeFranza's leadership, Harborlight collaborates with communities to

cultivate just, equitable, and sustainable housing opportunities.

DeFranza describes himself as a short, working-class Italian guy from New Jersey with an "accidental white-collar education." It was in New Jersey, while working a shift at an Atlantic City homeless shelter, that he witnessed the very real and pressing issues and harsh challenges related to homelessness. He has held nonprofit leadership roles for more than 25 years in both New England and the Midwest. Prior to leading Harborlight, he was the executive director of Guest House, an organization serving the homeless in Milwaukee. His commitment to social justice remains rooted in those experiences; and today, DeFranza remains passionately dedicated to housing creation and access while challenging the systems that stand in the way of affordable housing development.

Toward that end, DeFranza boldly addresses barriers to housing creation, racial equity, and access through public forums and community dialogues. He has provided testimony to local and state legislators to address the inequities that exist among housing-insecure populations, as well as the mechanisms that are overtly used to exclude and marginalize the disenfranchised.

His community impact through Harborlight continues to grow; today, the organization provides homes for more than 650 people on Boston's North Shore, with additional units in active development that will more than double its portfolio in the next three years.

DeFranza is married with four children. He holds an M.A. in Theology (Social Ethics) from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary and an M.A. in Community Economic Development from Southern New Hampshire University.

## HISTORY OF ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic "costumes" date back to medieval English custom when kings' courts were closely associated with Oxford University and there was a deep connection with the church. The elaborate vestments identify the degrees, disciplines, and levels of achievement of the wearer. In the United States, the Intercollegiate Commission set the standards for academic costumes in 1894.

For bachelor's or master's degrees, the color of the gown is black with no trim. The doctor's gown is faced down the front in black velvet with three bars of the same across the sleeves. The color code is the same for all degrees; however, the width of the hood edging, hood length, and sleeve style vary. The doctor's hood has edging 5-inches wide, a 4-foot hood length, and full, round sleeves. The master's hood edging is 3-inches wide, and the hood is 3.5-feet long with long pointed sleeves. The bachelor's hood edging is 2-inches wide, the hood measures 3 feet, and the sleeves are full-length square. The colors of the satin lining of the hood indicate the particular college or university that awarded the degree. Tassels for caps for all degrees may be black, with the exception of gold, which is most often worn for the doctor's degree.

## HISTORY OF THE LASELL UNIVERSITY BANNERS

The Lasell University banners exemplify the rich tapestry of the institution. Class banners vary greatly with color, motto, and pattern chosen by each individual class. These banners have been a part of the University's history since 1854. Early banners were typically designed with shields in red, white, and blue bearing class mottos; later, some were made of silk and occasionally embroidered. Class banners frequently provide insight into world events at the time of graduation. Many of Lasell's banners have been preserved in the University's Winslow Archives. Today, we proudly add the banner for the Class of 2023 to the collection as a way to proclaim the long and storied history of Lasell University.


# THE HISTORY OF LASELL UNIVERSITY

Lasell is a 172-year-old innovative educational institution and dynamic environment that embraces challenges and forges direct connections with professional outcomes so that students in pursuit of bachelor's and master's degrees, in addition to professional certifications, are prepared to thrive in the 21st century.

Founded in 1851 as the Auburndale Female Seminary, Lasell was the first two-year college for women in the United States at a time when women faced limited educational opportunities. The school was renamed Lasell Junior College in 1932, and evolved into a four-year institution — Lasell College — in 1989. In 1997, Lasell became coeducational and shortly after, established Lasell Village, an on-campus continuing-care retirement community focused on lifelong education and intergenerational collaboration. The institution's first graduate programs were launched in 2003.

In 2019, Lasell College became Lasell University. This latest chapter in our history is not a destination or an end point. Rather, it is part of an ongoing evolution that started in 1851 and continues to this day. In this unprecedented time of change, Lasell has flexed to meet profound new challenges in higher education and for those who seek its benefits.

Founder Edward Lasell strongly believed that students should be well-versed in both the liberal arts and the practical aspects of everyday life; in fact, early ads for the Seminary spoke of the school's unique curricular approach of blending theory and practice. Today, we call this Connected Learning. Our educational philosophy has modernized with the times, but at its core, has always been about learning through immersive intellectual and professional experiences.
